



NSW VETAB Guideline for the Management of RTOs delivering training for the Licensing of Persons Performing High Risk Work in NSW in association with WorkCover NSW

This is a guideline issued by the Vocational Education and Training Accreditation Board (VETAB) under section 32 of the *Vocational Education and Training Act 2005* (the Act).

Introduction

NSW VETAB is responsible for registering training organisations in NSW for delivery of nationally recognised training and assessment services under the vocational education and training system. WorkCover NSW is the Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) authority in NSW responsible for assessing and licensing persons to perform high risk work in NSW.

In April 2006 the National Standard for Licensing Persons Performing High Risk Work was declared.

NSW VETAB and WorkCover NSW have established a Statement of Agreement for the provision of training related to licensing for persons performing high risk work. This Guideline forms part of the Statement of Agreement.

General

On implementation of the National Standard for Licensing Persons Performing High Risk Work in NSW, training and assessment for high risk work covered by the National Standard will be delivered by registered training organisations in accordance with the requirements of the AQTF 2007 Essential Standards for Registration.

This Guideline covers the delivery of the following Units of Competency (UOCs) which may be delivered for licensing purposes in NSW as stand-alone units or as core units within qualifications:

- *CPCCLRG3001A Licence to perform rigging – basic level*
- *CPCCLRG3002A Licence to perform rigging – intermediate level*
- *CPCCLRG4001A Licence to perform rigging – advanced level*
- *CPCCLSF2001A Licence to erect and dismantle scaffolding – basic level*
- *CPCCLSF3001A Licence to erect and dismantle scaffolding – intermediate level*
- *CPCCLSF4001A Licence to erect and dismantle scaffolding – advanced level*
- *CPCCLTC4001A Licence to operate a tower crane*
- *CPCCLTC4002A Licence to operate a self erecting tower crane*
- *CPCCLBM3001A Licence to conduct a concrete placing boom*
- *CPCCLHS3002A Licence to operate a materials hoist*
- *CPCCLHS3001A Licence to operate a personnel and materials hoist*
- *TLILIC1208A Licence to operate a vehicle mounted loading crane*
- *TLILIC408A Licence to operate a derrick crane*
- *TLILIC708A Licence to operate a portable boom crane*
- *TLILIC808A Licence to operate a slewing mobile crane up to 20 tonnes*

- *TLILIC908A Licence to operate a slewing mobile crane up to 60 tonnes*

Purpose

This Guideline aims to ensure the quality and integrity of training and assessment for high risk work in NSW by enabling VETAB to manage the approval and suspension of the above Units of Competency with regard to the scope of registration of NSW RTOs in association with the authorisation of WorkCover NSW.

Statement

An applicant under section 11 of the Act that seeks to have included any or all of the above Units of Competency on its 'scope of registration' (as defined in the Act) must be approved (or provisionally approved) by WorkCover NSW to deliver training for the purposes of WorkCover licensing (WorkCover NSW Approval). If the applicant does not have WorkCover NSW approval or provisional approval, the Units of Competency are not to be included in the applicant's scope of registration.

An RTO that has any or all of the above Units of Competency in its scope of registration must continue to have WorkCover NSW approval. If the RTO loses WorkCover NSW approval, the Units of Competency may be removed from the RTO's scope of registration.

Communication between VETAB and WorkCover NSW

Within fourteen (14) days of either adding or removing any or all of the above Units of Competency to the scope of registration of a RTO, VETAB must advise WorkCover NSW of that fact. VETAB would expect to receive written notification from WorkCover NSW within fourteen (14) days in the event that WorkCover NSW withdraws approval from any RTO to whom WorkCover NSW approval was previously given.
